

Each year our Community Report Card provides a snapshot of what we've accomplished over the last 12 months. As we look back, 2022 was a year of more - more referrals, more children and adults served, and more people achieving what they want out of life.

We have seen an incredible 64 percent increase in referrals and supports in Early Intervention over the past five years. That means more babies and toddlers are receiving the therapies they need to learn and grow.

We helped 134 children and teens with behavioral challenges achieve balance and healing via *Tomorrow's Youth Project*, an approach that brings multiple systems together to help the entire family.

We exceeded capacity in *Skill Building for Transition* where 25 teens are having real world job experiences during the school day.

Your County Board also received more state, regional and local grants to serve children. In turn, we did more for our public-school partners by increasing our school grant awards and sharing our resources with more students in 2022.

The need for Direct Support Professionals has never been higher and our Quality Supports team assisted more

people than ever before to become DSPs in 2022. We are also part of Ohio's DSP Retention Payment Initiative, a first-of-its-kind investment into the incredible providers who help people live, learn and work.

We value relationships, and that's why we embraced process innovations in technology that have reduced paperwork so we have more time to spend with people.

We believe that how we are is as important as what we do. That is why we treat everyone with compassion, courtesy and respect in a trauma-informed, positive culture.

There is so much more to a fulfilling life than just having our needs met. That's why we also connect people with disabilities to the people and things they want, like places to live and learn, work and worship, volunteer and play.

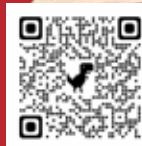
In other words, we want every person we support to get "more" out of life.

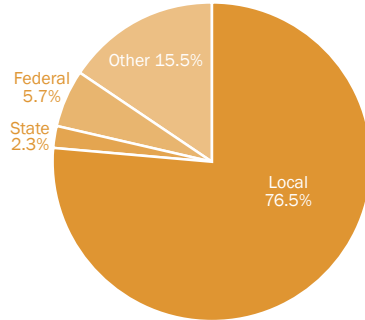

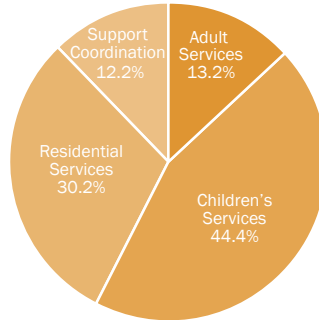
